

Constitution of Queensland 2001

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 4) 2017

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Short Title

1. This order in council may be cited as the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 4) 2017*.

Administrative Arrangements

2. (1) The public business of the State is distributed among Ministers as set out in the Schedule.
 - (2) Each Minister is to administer the matters set out in the Schedule next to the Minister's title as follows:
 - (a) the matters connected with the public business of the State listed under the heading '*Principal Ministerial Responsibilities*';
 - (b) the legislation listed under the heading '*Acts Administered*'; and
 - (c) the administrative units listed under the heading '*Administrative Units*'.
 - (3) Information in the Schedule under the heading '*Responsible Heads*' is included for information only and does not form part of this order.

Repeal of earlier Administrative Arrangements

3. The *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 3) 2017* is repealed.

- This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice by Toowoomba Regional Council (No. 01) 2017*.

Easement taken [ss.6 and 15D of the Act]

- The easement described in Schedule 1 is taken by Toowoomba Regional Council for drainage purposes, and vests in Toowoomba Regional Council on and from 22 December 2017.

Rights and obligations

- That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 2.

SCHEDULE 1**Easement Taken**

Easement D in lot 1 on SP 116255 on SP297263 (to be registered in the Land Registry), area 700m², part of Title Reference 50274050.

SCHEDULE 2**Easement Rights and Obligations**

- Council has the right to enter upon the Servient Tenement for the purpose of constructing drains, pipelines and related equipment and fittings below the surface of the Servient Tenement (**Relevant Drainage Works**) and thereafter using and maintaining the Relevant Drainage Works for the purpose of conveying stormwater and drainage via the Relevant Drainage Works under and through the Servient Tenement.
- Subject to clause 3, Council (including its employees, agents and other authorised persons) has the right to:
 - construct, add to, remove, inspect, maintain and repair the Relevant Drainage Works and to construct new Relevant Drainage Works in addition or in substitution for the Relevant Drainage Works;
 - do all such works and things through, across, in or under the Servient Tenement as are incidental to the proper exercise of the rights conferred by this Easement;
 - clear and keep clear the surface of the Servient Tenement by any means or method and to cut and remove timber, trees and undergrowth from the surface of the Servient Tenement and to burn off such timber, trees and undergrowth;
 - construct and maintain such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works as Council may consider necessary on the Servient Tenement (**Access Works**), provided that Council puts in place reasonable arrangements to ensure that the Access Works do not unduly restrict the right of the Owner to access the Servient Tenement; and
 - ingress and egress to and from the Servient Tenement, over the Land as is reasonably required by Council for the purpose of passing between the Servient Tenement and the nearest surveyed road or to another point of entry to or exit from the Land as Council considers is convenient or necessary.
- Except in the case of an emergency, as determined by Council acting reasonably, Council must give the Owner reasonable prior notice before accessing the Servient Tenement or any adjoining Land of the Owner for the purposes of clause 2. Subject to clause 4 and clause 7, in exercising its rights conferred pursuant to clause 2 of this Easement, Council must:
 - use reasonable endeavours to minimize (as far as practicable) any interference with or damage to the Owner's Land or property; and
 - promptly reinstate any such damage caused to the Owner's Land or property to the Owner's satisfaction, acting reasonably.

4. For the purposes of gaining access to the Servient Tenement, Council is entitled to pull down or break open any fencing on or adjacent to, the Servient Tenement, provided that if livestock is contained within the fenced area, Council must give the Owner reasonable notice to allow the Owner to secure the livestock.
5. Council must re-instate, with materials and workmanship not less than the quality of the materials and workmanship in the existing fence, any fences so damaged.
6. The Relevant Drainage Works are and remain the property of Council, notwithstanding any actual or apparent affixing to the Servient Tenement. Council is solely responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Relevant Drainage Works. Council must keep and maintain the Relevant Drainage Works in good repair.
7. The Owner must not at any time, without the permission of Council (which must not be unreasonably withheld or delayed):
- 7.1 erect any buildings or structures (other than fences) on the Servient Tenement or any part thereof in such a way as to unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Drainage Works and the proper and effective use of the Relevant Drainage Works by Council;
- 7.2 use the Servient Tenement or any part thereof or permit the Servient Tenement or any part thereof to be used in such a way as to unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Drainage Works and the proper and effective use of the Relevant Drainage Works by Council;
- 7.3 remove or stockpile (or permit the removal or stockpiling of) any soil, sand, gravel, or other substance or material on the Servient Tenement or construct any roads, dam walls or other earthworks on the Servient Tenement which would in any way unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Drainage Works or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Drainage Works by Council; or
- 7.4 damage, or destroy any vegetation (excluding regular mowing of grass, and removal of weeds and other pest species) that may serve a material useful purpose in reducing erosion of the Servient Tenement.
8. If any buildings, structures or other materials or things are erected or placed on the Servient Tenement in contravention of clause 7 (**Interfering Material**), Council may, in addition to any other remedies and having first given the Owner reasonable notice of its intention to invoke this clause, enter upon the Servient Tenement and remove or demolish the Interfering Material and, if it does so:
- 8.1 it may dispose of the Interfering Material or any resultant demolition materials in such manner as it sees fit without being liable to account to the Owner therefore (except as provided for in clause 8.2); and
- 8.2 it may recover, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, costs actually incurred by it in taking that action, less any moneys actually received by it as a result of disposing of the Interfering Material or any resultant demolition materials.
9. The benefit and burden of this Easement passes with and binds the Servient Tenement so as to enure to and bind all persons deriving title from and under Council and Owner respectively. The Owner will, whenever required by Council and at the expense of Council execute and do all such assurances and acts as are reasonably required for the proper and effective carrying into effect of the rights conferred under this Easement, but not so as to render the Owner liable to be called upon by Council to contribute towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Relevant Drainage Works.
10. Council indemnifies and agrees to keep indemnified the Owner in respect of any damage, loss or injuries suffered or incurred by the Owner and arising out of the wrongful or negligent use of the Servient Tenement by Council, its servants, agents or any other person authorised by Council.
11. The Owner's statutory obligation (if any) to contribute to upkeep of the Servient Tenement is excluded. The parties agree that subject to clause 7 there is no obligation on the Owner to maintain the Servient Tenement in any particular state.
12. Council acknowledges and agrees that, subject to clause 7, the Owner may access and use the Servient Tenement (including, without limitation, erecting or placing any building, structure or other materials or things on the Servient Tenement) for any purpose which is not inconsistent with the rights conferred by this Easement. Those purposes may include construction of roads or driveways over the Servient Tenement, construction of services or utilities in or over the Servient Tenement, construction of earthworks or retaining walls in or over the Servient Tenement.
13. To avoid doubt, the consent of Council is only required to access and use the Servient Tenement (including for the purposes described in clause 12) under clause 7, where that proposed access will unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Drainage Works and the proper and effective use of the Relevant Drainage Works by Council, otherwise the consent of Council is not required.
14. Definitions. The following expressions have the following meanings:
- Access Works** has the meaning given in clause 2.4 of this Easement.
- Council** means Toowoomba Regional Council.
- Easement** means this instrument of easement detailing the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement set out in this Schedule 2 over the Servient Tenement described in Schedule 1.
- Interfering Material** has the meaning given in clause 8 of this Easement.
- Land** means the land described as lot 1 on Survey Plan 116255, Title Reference 50274050.
- Relevant Drainage Works** has the meaning given in clause 1 of this Easement.
- Servient Tenement** means the area of land described in Schedule 1.
- Owner** means the registered owner of the Land.

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Land Notice (No 5) 2017*

Land taken (s.15D of the Acquisition of Land Act 1967)

2. Following agreement in writing, the land described in Schedule 1 is taken by Mackay Regional Council for recycled water storage and supply purposes and vests in Mackay Regional Council on and from 22 December 2017.

Easement taken (s.15D of the Acquisition of Land Act 1967)

3. Following agreement in writing, the easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Mackay Regional Council for the purposes of the conveyance of recycled water, access, maintenance and repair and vests in Mackay Regional Council on and from 22 December 2017.

Rights and obligations

4. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 3.

**SCHEDULE 3
Rights and obligations under Easement**

1. GRANT OF EASEMENT

The Grantor hereby grants to the Grantee, the Grantee's Employees and all person authorised by the Grantee the full and free right and liberty at all times hereafter with or without machinery, motor cars, and vehicles of any description laden or unladen to pass repass along over and upon and across the Servient Tenement for the Easement Purposes and to exercise all powers, authorities and discretions vested in it by law for the Easement Purposes.

2. GRANTEE'S RIGHTS

2.1 The Grantee has the right at all reasonable times, upon giving prior notice to the Owner (except in the case of an emergency when no notice will be required) with or without vehicles, machinery, plant and equipment and materials, to enter upon the Servient Tenement to pass and repass along the same at all times for the purposes of using and repairing the Works and in so doing the Grantee's Employees may:

- (1) remove and replace the Works with new Works;
- (2) change the size and number of any pipes forming part of the Works;

(3) extend, deepen, widen, repair, renew, mow, cleanse, add to, inspect and maintain the Works including altering, replacing, relaying or changing the size, shape or type;

(4) dig into, sink shafts into and open and break up the soil of the Servient Tenement;

(5) remove and dispose of soil created as a consequence of the Grantee exercising its rights under this Easement;

(6) do such other Works and things on or under the Servient Tenement as are incidental to the exercise of the Grantee's rights under this Easement;

(7) take down any fencing or structure erected on the Servient Tenement.

2.2 In exercising its rights under this Easement the Grantee and the Grantee's Employees will subject to Clause 3:

(1) exercise the rights in a proper and workmanlike manner so as to cause as little inconvenience and disruption as possible to the Grantor's Land;

(2) repair any damage it may cause to the surface of the Servient Tenement or adjoining land.

3. GRANTOR'S OBLIGATIONS

3.1 The Grantor must not without the prior written consent of the Grantee:

(1) construct or allow to be constructed upon the Servient Tenement any buildings or structures;

(2) permit the Servient Tenement to be used in such a way as to obstruct or interfere with the Easement Purposes, the Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Works by the Grantee;

(3) install or have installed any concrete or bitumen paths or driveways on the Servient Tenement or gardens or landscaping using brick, concrete or other permanent materials;

(4) alter the surface level of the Servient Tenement;

(5) obstruct, interrupt, impede, impair, or interfere with or divert the passage or conveyance of recycled water along the Servient Tenement and will not change or alter anything done by the Grantee in terms hereof.

3.2 If the Grantor wishes to construct upon the Servient Tenement any building or structure it will provide the Grantee with detailed plans enabling the Grantee to consider the request and the Grantee may in its absolute discretion refuse such request.

- 3.3 If the Grantee consents to the construction of a building or structure upon the Servient Tenement, the Grantor:
- (1) will ensure that the building or structure is built in a proper and tradesmanlike manner in accordance with the plans submitted to the Grantee and will be maintained so as not to interfere with the Works;
 - (2) acknowledges and accepts that the building or structure will be built upon the Servient Tenement at the sole risk of the Grantor and will be used and occupied at the sole risk of the Grantor;
 - (3) acknowledges and accepts that it may be necessary for the Grantee to:
 - (a) demolish the whole or part of the said building or structure;
 - (b) carry out work under or upon the surface of the Servient Tenement which may have an adverse impact upon the said building or structure or interfere with the use and enjoyment of the said building or structure or the land;
 - (4) acknowledges and accepts that it cannot make any claim for compensation whatsoever arising from the Grantee exercising its rights under this easement or at law;
 - (5) the Grantee's consent to erection of the said building or structure on the Servient Tenement shall not be deemed in any way an assumption by the Grantee of any obligation towards the Grantor or to any person on the Servient Tenement and the Grantee shall not be thereby deemed to incur any liability.
 - (6) indemnifies and will keep indemnified the Grantee against all actions, demands, claims, costs arising in any manner whatsoever from the construction, erection, use or occupation of the said building or structure upon the Servient Tenement.
4. **PROPERTY IN WORKS**
- 4.1 The Works remain the property of the Grantee despite being fixed to the Servient Tenement which is not inconsistent with the Grantee's rights under this Easement.
5. **REMOVAL OF WORKS**
- 5.1 In the event that this easement is terminated or surrendered for any reason, the Grantor must notify the Grantee within one (1) month from the date of termination/surrender:
- (a) of its requirement for the Grantee to remove the Works within 3 months, or such later date as the Grantee reasonably requires, of the date of surrender of this easement; or
 - (b) that it does not wish the Grantee to remove the Works under clause 5.1(a), and thereafter, the Works will become the property of the Grantor when that notice is received.
6. **GENERAL**
- 6.1 **NOTICES**
- (1) Any notice under this Easement must be in writing; and
 - (2) Either party may serve a notice to the other party by:
 - (a) giving it to that party personally;
 - (b) posting it to the last known address of that party;
 - (c) sending it to the party's facsimile number or electronic mail address.
 - (3) When served by:
 - (a) post a Notice will be deemed to have been received on the third business day after posting; and
 - (b) when sent by facsimile will be deemed to have been received at the time at which transmission confirmation is received by the Sender; and
 - (c) when sent by electronic mail will be deemed to have been received, if no electronic error notification is received by the sender, at the date and time when the electronic mail indicates it was sent.
- 6.3 **RISK**
- The Grantee uses the Servient Tenement and exercises its rights under this Easement at its own risk absolutely.
- 6.4 **COSTS**
- The Grantee shall pay the Grantor's costs of and incidental to this Easement, and the Grantee will pay the survey plan and registration fees in respect of this Easement and any plan necessary to effect registration of this Easement.
7. **CONSTRUCTION AND INTERPRETATION**
- 7.1 **DEFINITIONS**
- (1) **"Easement Purposes"** means the passage and conveyance of recycled water, access maintenance and repair including but not limited do:
 - (c) the installation of the Works by the Grantee on, in, over, under or through the Servient Tenement;

- (d) the use, alteration, addition, removal, replacement, reconstruction, substitution, maintenance, operation, upgrade and repair of the Works; and
- (e) any activity of any description which the Grantee has authority to undertake directly or indirectly in the exercise by it of its duties under the *Local Government Act 2009 (Qld)*.
- (2) **“Grantee”** means the Mackay Regional Council and its successors and assigns;
- (3) **“Grantee’s Employee’s”** means each of the Grantee’s employees, contractors or other persons authorised by the Grantee;
- (4) **“Grantor”** means the registered owner of the Servient Tenement and includes:
- (a) the executors, administrators and assigns of the Grantor and each of them;
- (b) the registered owner for the time being of the Servient Tenement and the land of which it forms part from time to time.
- (5) **“Servient Tenement”** means the easement area and includes any part of the Servient Tenement.
- (6) **“Work”** means:
- (a) open earth drains, pipes or mains for the Easement Purposes together with all other usual and necessary fittings and attachments; and
- (b) works for the protection and/or support of each of those things.
- 7.3 SEVERABILITY
If a provision contained in this Easement is invalid or unenforceable, that provision will, as far as possible, be read down to the extent necessary for it to be valid or enforceable but, if it cannot be read down, it will be severed from the document and the remaining provisions will remain in full force and effect.
- 7.4 HEADINGS
Headings are for convenience only and do not affect the interpretation or form part of this Easement.
- 7.5 LAND TITLE ACT
For the purpose of Part 6 Division 4 (Easements) of the Land Title Act 1994:
- (a) the Grantee is a public utility provider; and
- (b) this Easement is granted for the purpose of a public utility service.
