



# Agri-tourism biosecurity measures

## Keep your property protected

While Queensland and Australia currently remain free of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), lumpy skin disease (LSD) and African swine fever (ASF), outbreaks across Asia and Europe mean we must be vigilant.

The best defence against pests and diseases is to implement sound biosecurity practices on your farm.

The following QR codes provide quick, simple and cost-effective measures that can help secure your farm and secure your future.

### 1. Create a biosecurity management plan

Create a biosecurity management plan and update every 12 months if your operation changes or you experience a disease or pest incursion.



### 2. Check biosecurity entity registration

Check your biosecurity entity registration is up-to-date if you have any livestock or bees.



### 3. Display biosecurity signage

Use [this template](#) to create a sign for your property, which shows that you have a biosecurity management plan in place on your property (<https://bit.ly/3B0fkW8>).

### 4. Use Farm Check-in

Ensure all visitors use Farm Check-in or other methods when visiting your property.



### 5. Ensure visitors come clean, go clean

Before entering and leaving your farm, ensure visitors vehicles, clothing and footwear are clean and free of disease. Watch the Come clean, go clean video to learn how:
