## **AMNESTY DECLARATION**

The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Services and Minister for Corrective Services, the Hon. Mark Ryan MP and the Commissioner of the Queensland Police Service, Mr Ian Stewart announce that a Firearms Amnesty, in conjunction with the National Firearms Amnesty will operate from 1 July 2017 until 30 September 2017.

The effect of this amnesty is:

- A person will not be prosecuted for unlawfully possessing a firearm if the person is:
  - **directly** proceeding to surrender or register the item at a firearms dealer, or if it is not practicable to;
  - **directly proceeding, after making an appointment**, to surrender or register the item at a police station;
- The amnesty will be applicable to Category A, B, C, D, E, H, M and R firearms and weapons;
- For the purposes of the amnesty, the Permit to Acquire procedure and relevant schedule fee is waived; and
- The amnesty will not waive any conditions endorsed upon a licence.

PLAN 2014 MADE UNDER THE ALIGNMENT AMENDMENT RULES AND  
THE *PLANNING ACT 2016*, SECTION 293**

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday 30 May 2017 Brisbane City Council made the Minor Amendment to *Brisbane City Plan 2014 - Planning Act 2016* alignment under the Alignment Amendment Rules and section 293 of the *Planning Act 2016* to the *Brisbane City Plan 2014* (the alignment amendment). The alignment amendment will commence on Monday 3 July 2017.

The alignment amendment has the purpose and general effect of responding to changes to decision-making rules, changes to regulated content and the application of a new template for local government planning schemes. The alignment amendment contains the following:

- wide-ranging terminology changes to replace terminology from the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* with terminology used in the *Planning Act 2016*;
- application of the Alignment Amendment Planning Scheme Template changes including incorporation of the new mandatory zone purpose and definitions;
- required technical revisions;
- amendments to improve and clarify assessment benchmarks, including zone codes, to ensure they are sufficiently robust to permit assessment as required by the decision rules for code assessment.

#### **TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE BY THE MINISTER (No 02) 2017**

##### **Short title**

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice by the Minister (No 02) 2017*.

##### **Easement taken [ss.6 and 9(7) of the Act]**

2. The easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Moreton Bay Regional Council for drainage purposes and vests in Moreton Bay Regional Council on and from 7 July 2017.

##### **Rights and obligations**

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

#### **SCHEDULE 1**

#### **1 DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION**

##### **1.1 Definitions**

In this Easement the following expressions shall have the meanings assigned to them below:-

- (a) Council means Moreton Bay Regional Council and its successors and assigns;
- (b) Owner means the registered owner of the land and the successors and assigns
- (c) Relevant Works  
overland or underground drains, pipes, conduits and channels for the passage or conveyance of rainwater and other lawful discharges to local government drainage through, across or under the Easement together with manholes, field inlet pits and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments as well as works for the protection and/or support of all such things;

##### **1.2 Interpretation**

In this Easement:-

- (a) a reference to a statute includes Orders in Council, Proclamations, Regulations, Rules, Local Laws and Ordinances made under the statute and any statute amending, consolidating or replacing the statute;
- (b) headings have been included for ease of reference and guidance and this Easement is to be construed without reference to them;
- (c) the singular number includes the plural and vice versa;
- (d) words importing a masculine gender includes all other genders; and
- (e) words importing persons include companies and corporations and vice versa.

1.3 If a covenant contained in this Easement is or becomes

invalid or unenforceable, the remaining covenants contained in this Easement remain in full force and effect;

1.4 If the Owner or Council comprise 2 or more legal entities, the covenants contained in this Easement bind each of them jointly and severally.

#### **2 RIGHTS OF COUNCIL**

2.1 The Council has the full and free right and liberty at all times, after the date of this Easement, to enter upon the Easement for the purposes of constructing and thereafter forever using and maintaining the Relevant Works as it shall from time to time think fit and in so doing, the Council by its employees, agents and other persons authorised by the Council shall have the right to:-

- (a) construct, install, extend, deepen, widen, cleanse, add to, remove, inspect, maintain and repair the Relevant Works and when and where thought fit by the Council to remove and replace the Relevant Works with new Relevant Works (whether of a similar nature to those replaced or not);
- (b) to change the size and number of any pipes which form part of the Relevant Works;
- (c) dig into, sink shafts in, and erect scaffolding upon the Easement and to open and break up the soil of the Easement or any part of the Easement including its sub-surface;
- (d) remove and dispose of spoil created as a consequence of the Council exercising its rights under this Easement;
- (e) clear and keep clear the Easement by any means or method and to cut and remove timber, trees and undergrowth from the Easement and to burn off such timber, trees and undergrowth;
- (f) construct and maintain on the Easement such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works as the Council shall consider necessary;
- (g) enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement for all or any of the purposes aforesaid with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever;
- (h) enter and exit to and from the Easement over such part or parts of the Owner's land adjoining or adjacent to the Easement as the Council shall consider most convenient or necessary for the purpose of passing between the Easement and

- the most convenient point of entry to or exit from the Owner's land (whether adjoining a constructed road or not);
- (i) do such other works and things through, across, in or under the Easement as are incidental to the proper exercise of the rights granted to the Council under this Easement;
- (j) use such part or parts of the Owner's land immediately adjacent to or adjoining either side of the Easement as the Council considers reasonable or necessary for the proper exercise of the rights granted to the Council under this Easement.
- 3 PROPERTY IN RELEVANT WORKS
- 3.1 The Relevant Works are and remain the property of the Council notwithstanding any actual or apparent affixing to the Easement. The Council shall be solely responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Relevant Works.
- 4 REMOVAL OF FENCING
- 4.1 To gain access to the Easement the Council may pull down or break open any fencing on or adjacent to the Easement. However, if livestock are contained within the fenced area, the Council must give reasonable notice to the Owner to enable the Owner to secure the livestock.
- 5 REINSTATEMENT OF FENCING
- 5.1 The Council must either:-
- (a) reinstate all fences (other than a fence erected in contravention of Clause 6) damaged by the Council in the exercise and performance of any of the rights and liberties granted to the Council under this Easement; or
- (b) if the fences are not reinstated, install a gate using materials and employing workmanship which is not less than the quality of the materials and workmanship in the existing fence. The gate installed pursuant to this subclause becomes the property of the owner of the fence in which the gate is installed and after installation shall be maintained by the owner.
- 6 NO STRUCTURES ON THE EASEMENT
- 6.1 The Owner shall not at any time without the express written permission of the Council (which must not be unreasonably withheld):-
- (a) erect any buildings or structures upon the Easement or any part of it;
- (b) permit the Easement or any part of it to be used in such a way as to obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by the Council;
- (c) install concrete, bitumen or other pavement or driveways on the Easement or gardens or landscaping involving concrete, brick or other permanent materials;
- (d) remove or stockpile or permit the removal or stockpiling of any soil, sand, gravel or other substance or material on the Easement or construct any roads, dam walls or other earthworks on the Easement which would in any way obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by the Council.
7. DAMAGE TO STRUCTURES
- 7.1 The Council in its sole discretion, shall determine how and in what manner the rights granted to the Council under this Easement are exercised. The Council must not wilfully damage or destroy any matter to any extent greater than is reasonably necessary in order to exercise the Council's rights under this Easement but:-
- (a) the Council is not otherwise responsible for any damage to or destruction of any matter in the course of the exercise by the Council of its rights under this Easement; and
- (b) subject to Clause 5.1, the Council is not under any obligation to reinstate or repair any matter damaged or destroyed in consequence of the exercise by the Council of its rights under this Easement and its only obligation where any such matter has been so damaged or destroyed is to leave the Easement in as clean and tidy state as practicable having regard to the nature of the matter which has been damaged or destroyed and the work which it has done; and
- (c) the Council is not in any event responsible for any inconvenience or disturbance to the owners or occupiers of the Easement arising out of the exercise by the Council of its rights under this Easement.
- 7.2 In this clause, the term "matter" means buildings, structures or other materials or things erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement (whether in contravention of Clause 6 or otherwise) and trees and plants within the Easement.
8. REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORISED STRUCTURES
- 8.1 If a building, structure or other material or thing (in this clause called "a relevant matter") is erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement in contravention of Clause 6, the Council may, in addition to any other remedies and after having first given the Owner reasonable notice of its intention to invoke this clause, enter upon the Easement and remove or demolish the relevant matter and, if it does so:-
- (a) it may dispose of the relevant matter or any resultant demolition materials in such manner as it sees fit without being liable to account to the Owner therefore (except as provided in subclause (b) of this clause); and
- (b) it may recover, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, costs actually incurred by it in taking that action (including internal wage and salary costs) less any moneys actually received by it as a result of disposing of the relevant matter or any resultant demolition materials.
9. PROTECTION OF RELEVANT WORKS
- 9.1 The Owner will not do any act or make any omission which will jeopardise or prejudicially affect the safety or reliable working of any Relevant Works.
10. FURTHER ASSURANCES
- 10.1 The benefit and burden of this Easement shall pass with and bind the Easement so as to ensure to and bind all persons deriving title thereto from and under the Owner and Council respectively and the Owner, whenever required by the Council or the person or persons for the time being entitled to the benefit of this Easement, must do all such things and give all such assurances as are reasonably required for the proper and effective carrying into effect of the rights conferred under this Easement but not so as to render the Owner liable to be called upon to contribute towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Relevant Works.

**QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT ELECTRICITY REBATE**

1. A Queensland Government Electricity Rebate is available to a customer provided the customer:
  - (a) holds one of the following:
    - (i) a current Pensioner Concession Card; or
    - (ii) a current Health Care Card; or
    - (iii) Repatriation Health Card for All Conditions (Gold Card) and is in receipt of one of the following payments:
      - (A) War Widow (including Widowed Mother [AMS] Pension); or
      - (B) Special Rate T.P.I. (including Blinded Disability) Pension; or
    - (iv) Queensland Seniors Card; or
    - (v) Asylum seeker status (ImmiCard) with a Bridging Visa Subclass 050, 051 or 070; and
  - (b) is a customer of a retail entity at the premises for which the rebate is claimed and the premises is the customer's principal place of residence, and the only residence in Queensland for which the customer claims the rebate; and
  - (c) lives alone or shares the premises in respect of which the rebate is claimed with:
    - (i) the customer's spouse; or
    - (ii) other persons who hold a current and valid card of the type described in paragraph (a) above; or
    - (iii) other persons wholly dependent on the customer; or
    - (iv) other persons who receive an income support payment from Centrelink, Department of Human Services or Department of Veterans' Affairs and who do not pay rent; or
    - (v) other persons who live with the customer to provide care and assistance and who do not pay rent; and
  - (d) declares that no other person(s) except casual visitors share the residence with the customer; and
  - (e) makes application for a rebate either by submitting the relevant form or, at the discretion of the retail entity, by providing the relevant information and declarations by telephone or electronic means.

2. Where an electricity account is in more than one name, and more than one resident is eligible to receive the rebate, each resident may have their eligibility established. However, only one rebate per household will be paid.
3. Only one rebate per household will be payable in respect of premises supplied by a card-operated meter, although other household residents are able to have their eligibility for the rebate established.
4. The retail entity may, at any time, require a new application from a customer and if the customer fails to lodge a new application within the time specified by the retail entity the rebate shall cease.
5. A Queensland Government Electricity Rebate is also applicable to the electricity account of residential home parks and other similar multi-tenanted residential premises provided the following sub-conditions are met:
  - (a) the customer (i.e. the owner or operator of the multi-tenanted residential premises) of the retail entity at the premises concerned –
    - (i) supplies electricity to the separately identifiable vans, flats or home units, or other similar living units at the premises; and
    - (ii) charges for electricity on the basis of metered consumption; and
    - (iii) is claiming the rebate on behalf of eligible persons (other than the person being a customer of the retail entity) residing at the premises ('claimant residents'); and
    - (iv) will fully pass on the rebate to each claimant resident by way of a reduction in charges for electricity; and
    - (v) has obtained each claimant resident's authority to:
      - (A) apply for the rebate; and
      - (B) verify the claimant resident's details with the Australian Government Department of Human Services or the Department of Veterans' Affairs or the Department of Immigration and Border Protection or the Queensland Government Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services; and
      - (C) disclose their details in connection with eligibility and receiving the rebate; and
    - (vi) has sighted the claimant resident's Pensioner Concession Card, Health Care Card, Repatriation Health Card for all Conditions (Gold Card), Queensland Seniors Card or ImmiCard at the time the application for the rebate is made, to ensure it is issued in the name of the claimant resident; and
  - (b) each separately identifiable living unit for which the rebate is claimed is occupied, from the day the claimant resident has applied to the customer, by persons who, if they had been supplied directly by the retail entity, would have been eligible for the electricity rebate; and
  - (c) a rebate is applicable to claimant residents for electricity consumed in the billing period to which the customer's electricity account relates, from the day the claimant resident has applied to the customer; and



- (d) a completed rebate application form, in writing, must be produced with the customer's electricity account at the time payment is tendered.
6. The rebate is \$ **0.8489** (GST exclusive) per day applied against the dollar and cents value of the electricity consumed based on the applicable (GST exclusive) tariff.

The rebate paid shall not be greater than the amount billed (excluding GST) for customer retail services provided to the customer in the billing period to which the rebate relates.

For rebate recipients supplied with card-operated meters, given these customers do not receive an electricity bill, the retail entity will agree with the Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services for a delivery process providing, over the financial year, a rebate on electricity costs comparable with the rebate received by customers on other metering arrangements.

### **RELIEF FROM ELECTRICITY CHARGES WHERE DROUGHT DECLARATION IN FORCE**

Relief assistance also available for Queensland farmers in drought declared areas through waivers or reimbursements of fixed charge components of relevant electricity accounts.

#### **Customers of Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd**

A Standard Contract Customer of Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd who is a farmer in a drought declared area or whose property is individually drought declared under Queensland Government administrative processes may be eligible for one or more of the following forms of relief from electricity charges:

#### **(A) Waiving of fixed charge components of electricity charges**

If a customer of Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd who is a farmer in a drought declared area or whose property is individually drought declared, does not have access to, or has severely restricted access to, farm or irrigation water, the fixed components of the customer's electricity charges shall be waived. These fixed charge components include chargeable demand (annual) under Tariff 66 and daily supply charge, but exclude minimum demand charges.

Provided the drought declaration remains operative, the waiver applies to all eligible fixed charges applicable to any account being used for pumping water for farm or irrigation purposes. The waiver shall continue to apply until the drought declaration is revoked.

#### **(B) Deferral of payment**

If a customer of Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd who is a farmer in a drought declared area or whose property is individually drought declared cites financial difficulties as a result of the drought, the customer is entitled to defer payment of the customer's electricity accounts relating to farm usage.

Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd may charge interest on deferred accounts. However, the rate of any interest charged must not be more than the Bank Bill reference rate for 90 days, as published on the first business day of each quarter.

Subject to the maximum rate of interest that may be charged, the terms of the deferred payment and the repayment of deferred amounts following revocation of the drought declaration will be as agreed between Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd and the customer concerned.

**Eligibility for Relief**

A customer of Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd seeking relief from electricity charges on the basis that the customer is a farmer who is in a drought declared area or whose property is individually drought declared, must apply in writing to Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd.

If required by Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd, the customer must provide:

- a) evidence that the customer's property is in a drought declared area or is individually drought declared, including the effective date of such drought declaration;
- b) evidence of the water pumping restrictions applicable to the customer's property; and
- c) for tariffs other than Tariffs 62, 65 and 66, a Statutory Declaration stating the specific account(s), and that the connection is being used primarily for pumping water for farm or irrigation purposes; and/or
- d) a Statutory Declaration stating that the customer is experiencing financial difficulties as a result of the drought, the specific account(s) and that the connection is being used primarily for farm purposes.

**Customers of other retailers**

Customers of retailers other than Ergon Energy Queensland Pty Ltd who are farmers in drought declared areas or who have a property which is individually drought declared under Queensland Government administrative processes can apply directly to the Department of Energy and Water Supply for reimbursement of the fixed charge components of the customer's electricity charges.

These fixed charge components include chargeable demand (annual) under Tariff 66 and daily supply charge, but exclude minimum demand charges.

Provided the drought declaration remains operative, the reimbursement applies to all eligible fixed charges applicable to any account being used for pumping water for farm or irrigation purposes and ceases once the drought declaration is revoked.

(b) is a customer of a retailer at the premises for which the rebate is claimed and the premises is the customer's principal place of residence, and the only residence in Queensland for which the customer claims the rebate; and

(c) lives alone or shares the premises in respect of which the rebate is claimed with:

- (i) the customer's spouse; or
- (ii) other persons who hold a current and valid card of the type described in paragraph (a) above; or
- (iii) other persons wholly dependent on the customer; or
- (iv) other persons who receive an income support payment from Centrelink, Department of Human Services or Department of Veterans' Affairs and who do not pay rent; or
- (v) other persons who live with the customer to provide care and assistance and who do not pay rent; and

declares that no other person(s) except casual visitors share the residence with the customer; and

(d) makes application for a rebate either by submitting the relevant form or, at the discretion of the retailer, by providing the relevant information and declarations by telephone or electronic means.

2. Where a gas account is in more than one name, and more than one resident is eligible to receive the rebate, each resident may have their eligibility established. However, only one rebate per household will be paid.
3. The retailer may, at any time, require a new application from a customer and if the customer fails to lodge a new application within the time specified by the retailer the rebate shall cease.
4. A Queensland Government Reticulated Natural Gas Rebate is also applicable to the gas account of residential home parks and other similar multi-tenanted residential premises provided the following sub-conditions are met:

  - (b) each separately identifiable living unit for which the rebate is claimed is occupied, from the day the claimant resident has applied to the customer, by persons who, if they had been supplied directly by the retailer, would have been eligible for the Reticulated Natural Gas Rebate; and
  - (c) a rebate is applicable to claimant residents for gas consumed in the billing period to which the customer's gas account relates, from the day the claimant resident has applied to the customer; and
  - (d) a completed rebate application form, in writing, must be produced with the customer's gas account at the time payment is tendered.
5. The rebate is **\$0.1776** (GST exclusive) per day applied against the dollar and cents value of the gas consumed based on the applicable (GST exclusive) tariff.

The rebate paid shall not be greater than the amount billed (excluding GST) for customer retail services provided to the customer in the billing period to which the rebate relates.
