

#### Logan catchment area

The Logan catchment includes the Loganlea Child Safety Service Centre and the Logan Central Child Safety Service Centre.

#### Logan catchment profile

On 30 June 2012, it was estimated there were 128,026 people residing within the Logan catchment area. This represented approximately 3% of the estimated resident population of Queensland (4,565,529 people). The estimated number of children aged 0-17 years was 33,601 people (approximately 3% of the Queensland population of children aged 0-17 years).

The population of people who identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander in Logan as at 30 June 2012 was 3,494 (2.9% of the total population in the catchment). In Queensland, the population of people who identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander was 155,824 (3.6% of the total population).

As at September 2013, the Logan unemployment rate was 8.2% compared to the Queensland average of 5.9%. Logan also had 37.4% of its population in SEIFA Quintile 1 (most disadvantaged) compared to 20% for the whole of Queensland.

As at 30 June 2012 the percentage of one-parent households was also higher than the whole of Queensland at 20.7% compared to 16.1% respectively.
